

Policing Project at New York University School of Law Seeks Program Manager to Work with the Federal Monitoring Team in Cleveland

The Policing Project at the New York University School of Law is a dynamic, growing organization dedicated to bringing democratic accountability to policing. We work with communities and police departments across the country to ensure that police department policies and practices are transparent, efficacious, and adopted with public input. The Policing Project seeks a full-time **Senior Program Manager** to lead its work with the Cleveland Federal Police Monitor. The Federal Monitor oversees the agreement between the City of Cleveland and the Department of Justice to overhaul the City's policing practices and ensure that they are constitutional, effective, and consistent with community values. The Monitor works closely with all of the key stakeholders, provides technical assistance to the CDP, and reports regularly on progress to the federal district court.

The Policing Project has been retained by the Monitor to help ensure that Cleveland residents have ongoing input into the reform process. This past year, the Policing Project helped gather community input on the police department's use of force, community policing, and bias-free policing policies. In future years the Policing Project will work on a range of issues including street encounters, searches and seizures, and oversight and accountability. This is an exciting opportunity to work with a wide range of stakeholders in innovative ways on pressing problems.

The Senior Program Manager will report to the Director of the Policing Project as well as the Cleveland Police Monitor. The Program Manager will be responsible for:

- Developing and managing a successful community engagement program around Cleveland Division of Police (CDP) policies and practices;
- Conducting legal and policy research;
- Drafting court papers
- Supervising and coordinating assignments and tasks for the Policing Project's legal externs.

The Senior Program Manager also may be asked to assist the Policing Project with other community engagement efforts around the country.

Desired Experience and Qualifications

- J.D. degree and two or more years of experience;
- Self-motivated, diligent, and able to meet deadlines while working with multiple stakeholders;
- Ability to work independently as well as collaboratively;
- Strong research, writing, and communication skills;
- Willingness to travel;
- A demonstrated commitment to criminal justice and/or public interest work.
